We now have the front well installed and the center island now has active sprinklers. We are starting to work on installing sprinklers the front side mulch areas, along with some future Low voltage wiring to have the sides light up to give us a better grand entrance appearance. Thanks to Kevin, Brian, Dave & Joe for the help.

We have recently found that one of the retention ponds concrete drain swoop was having erosion happening under the concrete and Brian and Dave have spent a day pumping concrete under the base of the drain swoop to prevent any further erosion or special assessment of repair. Thankyou Dave for your help..

There are a few areas between a few houses around the center retention pond that appear to be very soggy due to little drainage. Brian with some help will plan next year on installing some French drains to take this excess water to the pond more efficiently giving those neighbors hopefully a drier back yard as it should have been.

Another item addressed was the pole lights in our community which FPL has finally addressed the leaning poles and we are now waiting for the existing light fixtures to be replaced which we were told can take 6 months due to scheduling, but it is in process.

The Board of Directors has made a lot of progress and Recently I spoke with some road crew doing survey work near our entrance and was told that they are starting the steps for extending the sidewalks and installing a crosswalk near the Treaty Park entrance. This was all thanks to Nancy who had personally been effected by an issue with the dangers at the roadway and made an extreme effort to get the county to make it safer for walkers.
